**“ADVENTURE ON THE HILL”**  
***A Family Fun Day at the Peterborough Museum & Archives***  
***February 14, 2010 from 2-4pm***

Need a break from the Olympics? Feel like a family afternoon full of adventure, activity and live bird demonstrations? Put down that TV remote and join the Peterborough Museum & Archives for some *Adventure on the Hill* on Sunday, February 14, 2010, from 2-4pm.

Marking the start of *Heritage Week*, the Museum will be offering a chance for families to enjoy games, crafts and activities, themed to coincide with its latest exhibition, “Places of Power – Objects of Veneration in the Canadian Arctic,” on loan from the Canadian Museum of Civilization until March 21, 2010.

“Places of Power” explores a number of sacred sites in Canada’s Arctic and features dozens of breathtaking photographs - from starkly beautiful landscapes to the timeless and majestic inukshuk.

The Centre for the Conservation of Specialized Species will be here with live raptor demonstrations. Learn and play traditional Inuit games, build a model inukshuk, make your very own baby polar bear paw imprint, and find out why the Vancouver Olympics has adopted the inukshuk as its primary symbol.

Adventure on the Hill is a free event and open to everyone. The Peterborough Museum & Archives is a barrier-free facility. The Museum is located on Armour Hill at 300 Hunter Street, East, in Peterborough.
