Make your spirits bright this winter with the latest limited edition print from the Peterborough Museum & Archives. Orders for “Jingle Bells” will be accepted until **January 10, 2010**. Prints are 11”x14”, unframed and unmatted for a cost of \$50.00 + tax (\$56.50 total each).

Customers can request that their order be shipped for an additional \$15.00. Gift cards are available upon request. The edition will be limited to the number of advance orders placed. Prints will be ready for pick-up or shipping at the end of January, 2010.

Taken one hundred years ago, in 1910, “Jingle Bells” features the Cavanah children (relatives of well-known photographer, Fred Roy’s wife, Mona Cavanah) in a scene that evokes memories of a simpler time.

Sleighting was a popular winter pastime during the Victorian era. James Lord Pierpont (1822-1893) composed “Jingle Bells” in celebration of winter fun, one of many joyful songs written in New England during the late 19<sup>th</sup> century.

“Jingle Bells” (Film negative # 2000-012-000863-5) is part of the Balsillie Collection of Roy Studio Images, which is recognized for capturing all aspects of life in the Peterborough region.
